The United States is the main topic of study in both the History and Geography classes. Geography goes a little farther to include Canada and South America.

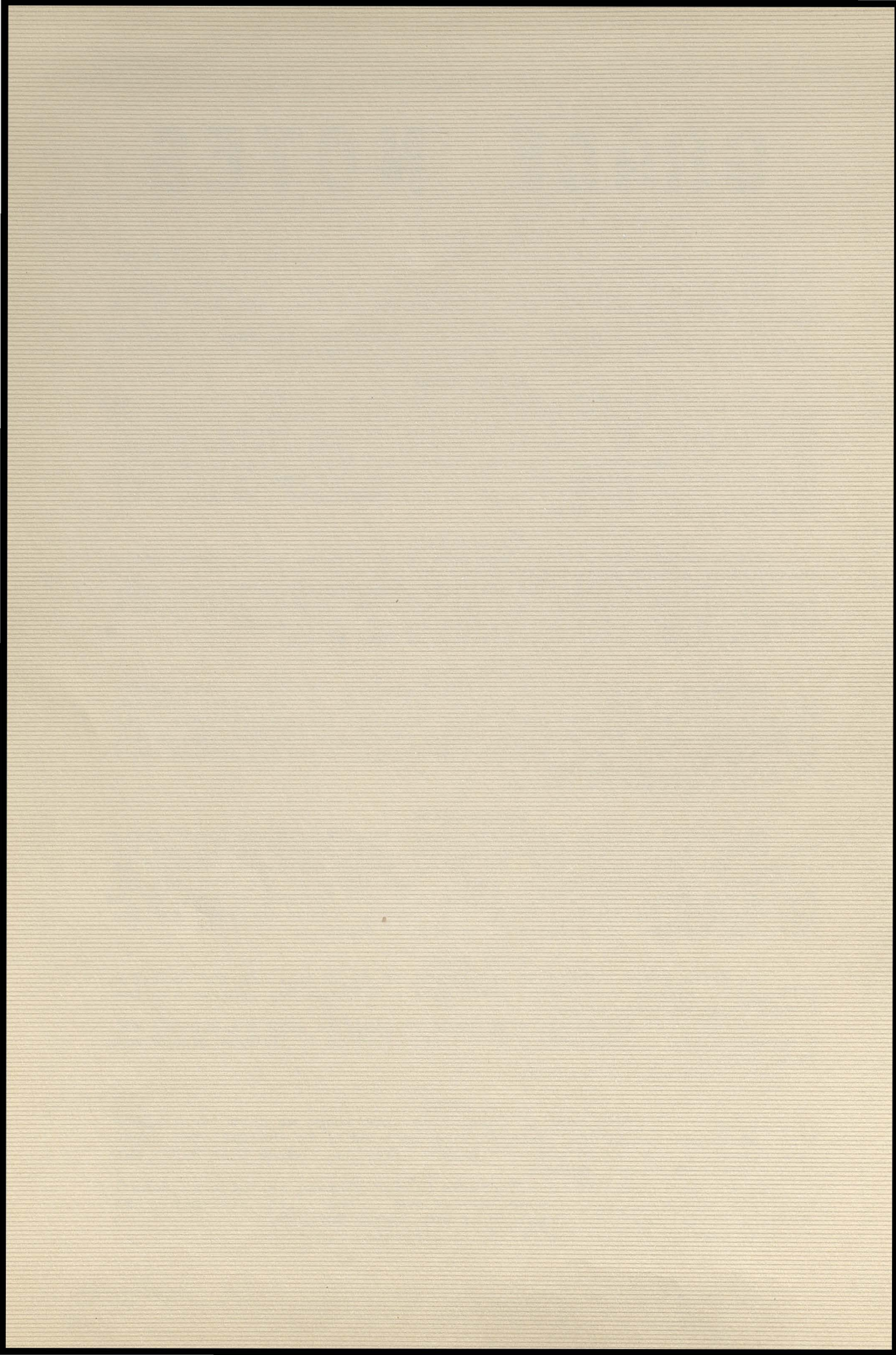

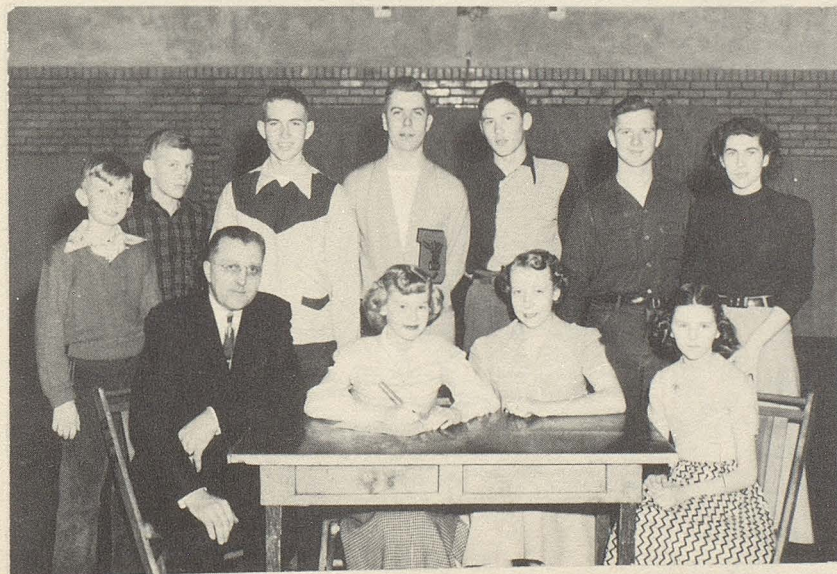
SCHOOL PATROL

STUDENT COUNCIL

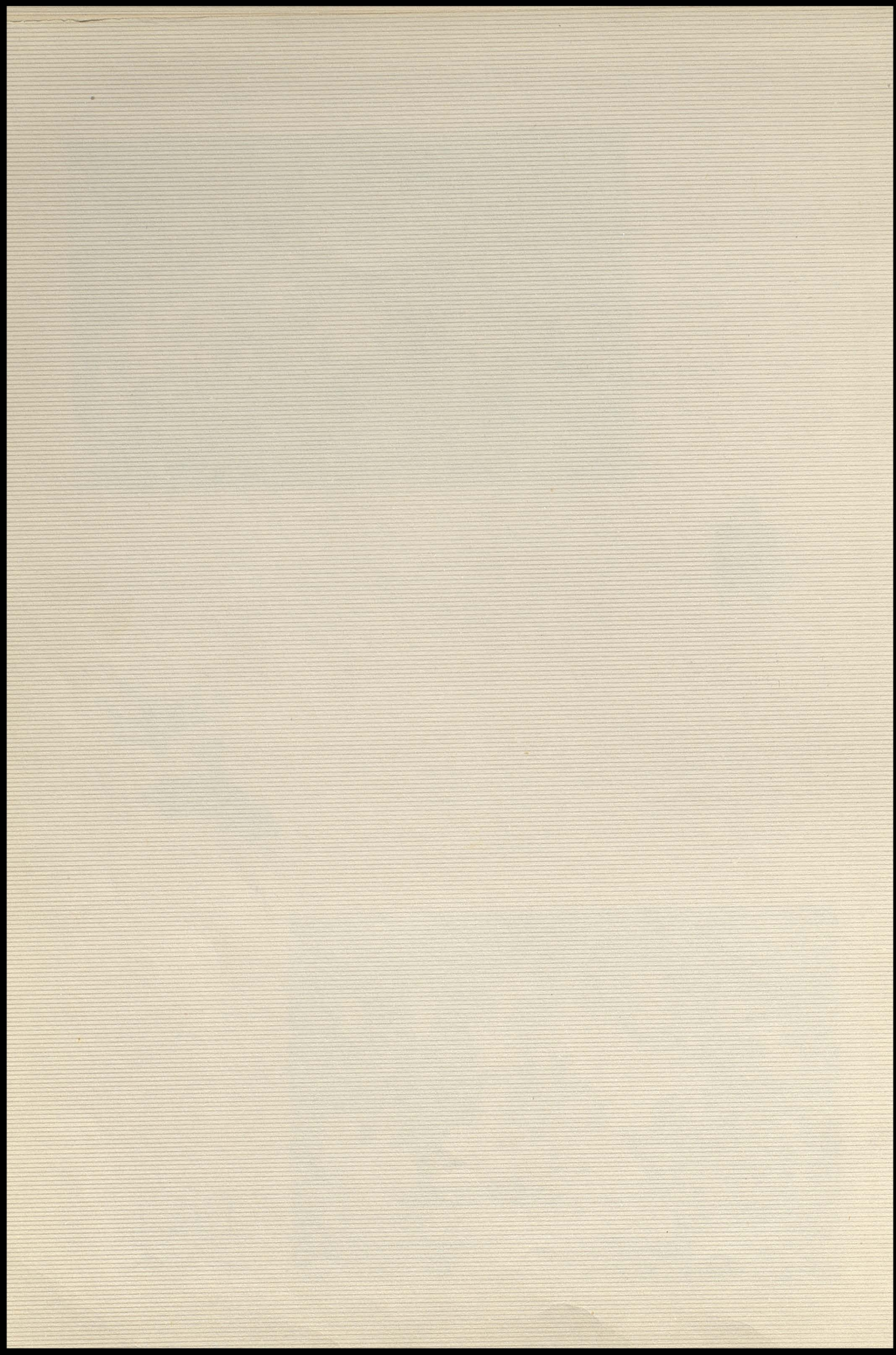
