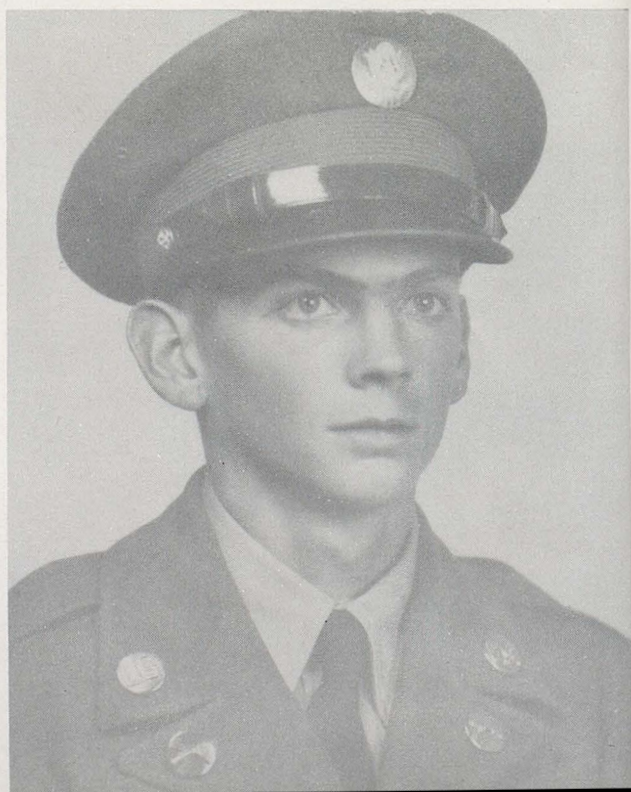
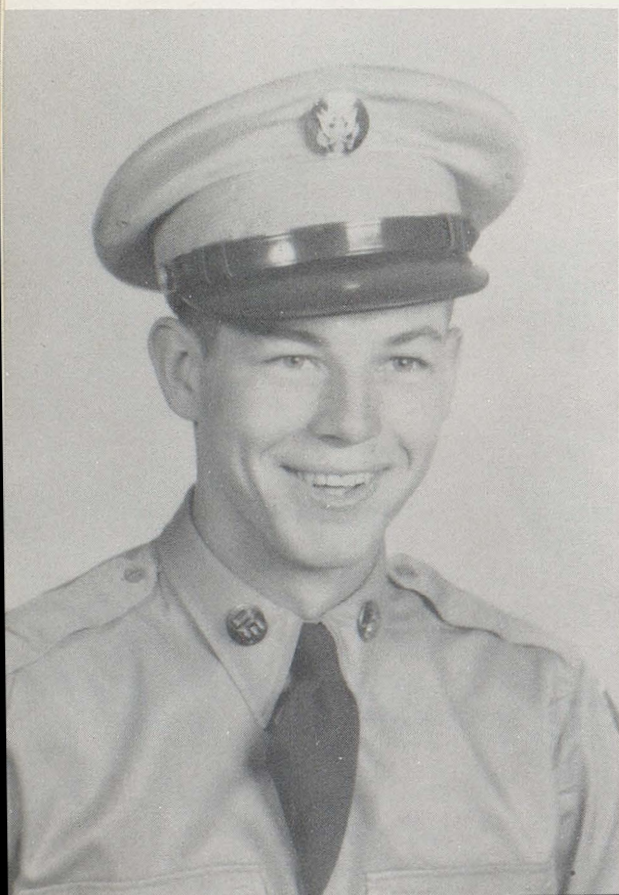
Lyman Arionus and Albert Braun, former members of the class of '51, enlisted in the United States Army after completing their sophomore year.

The division of second graders taught by Miss Scheneker was kept busy this year with the usual "readin', ritin', and 'rithemetec."

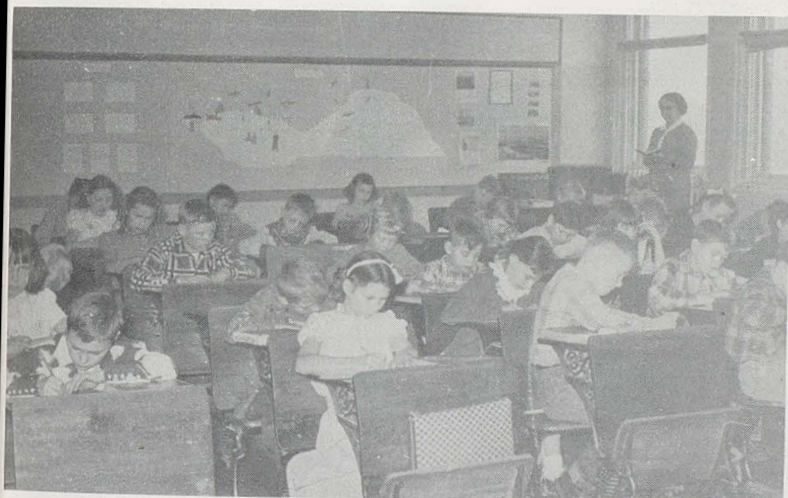






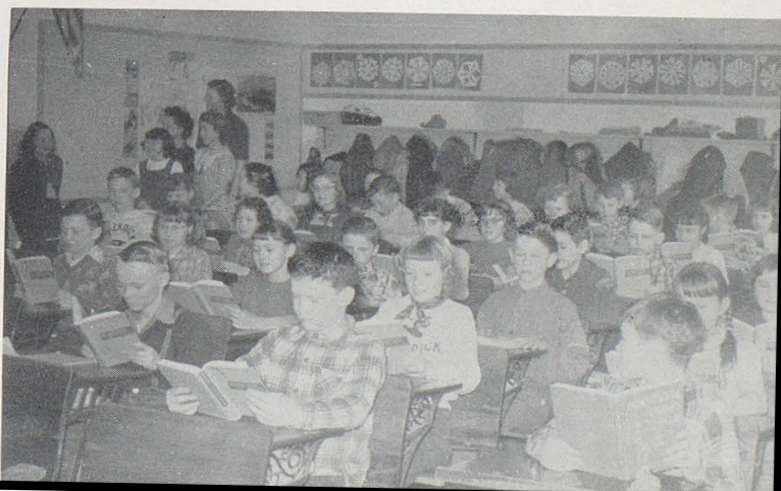
Miss Haugen has 38 third graders. They have been working in booklets showing the different clothing for the four seasons.

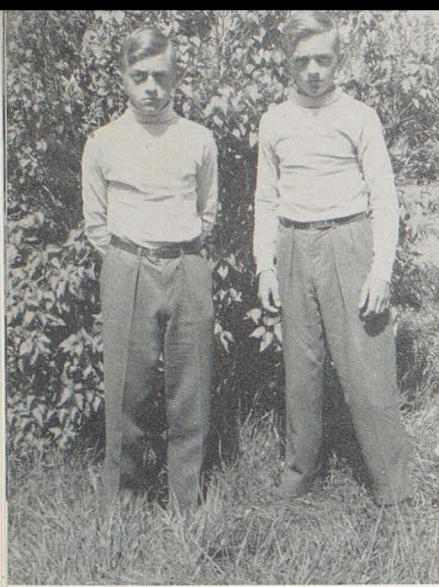


The 40 fifth graders made booklets on the U.S. in their Social Studies class. Their teacher is Miss Duda.

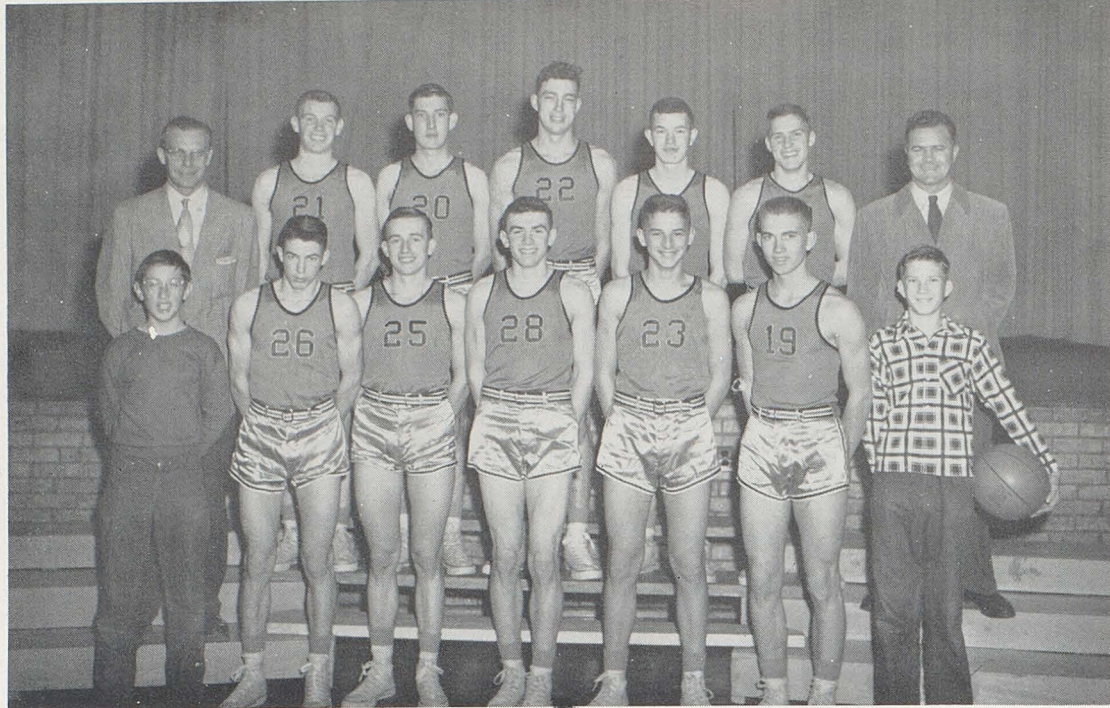
The 1950 Blackduck High School football team won their first three games then after losing to Big Fork they couldn't get back in the win column.
