## Juniors

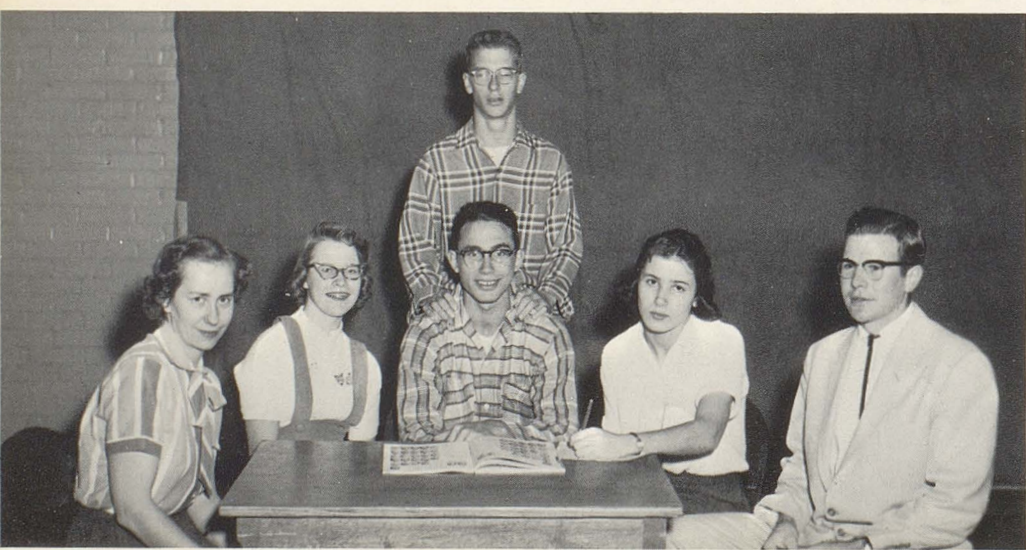

## Band

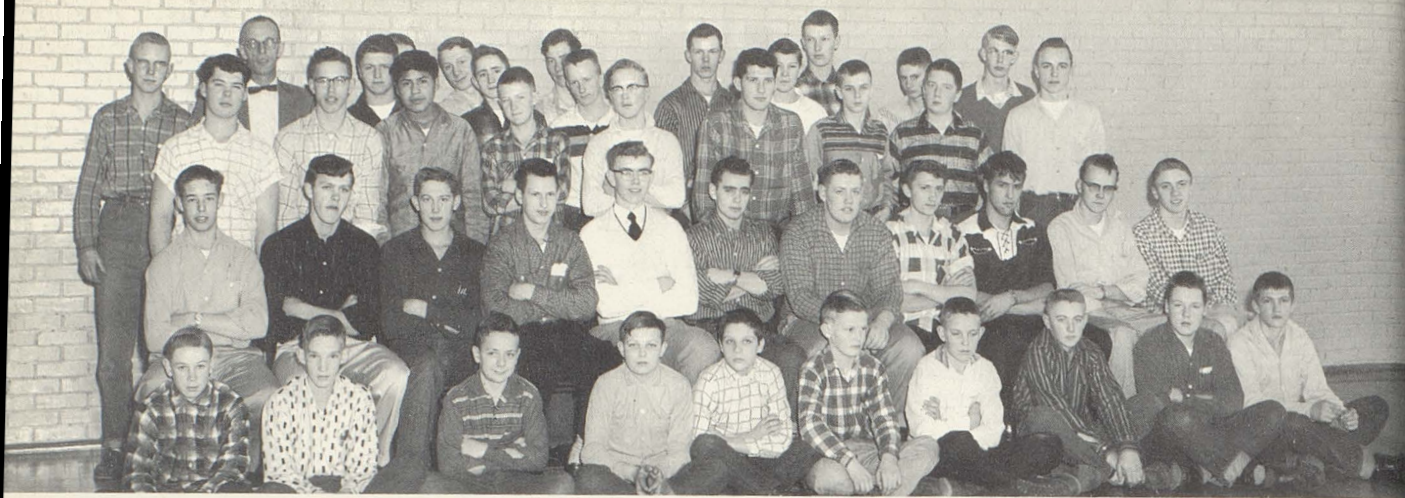
