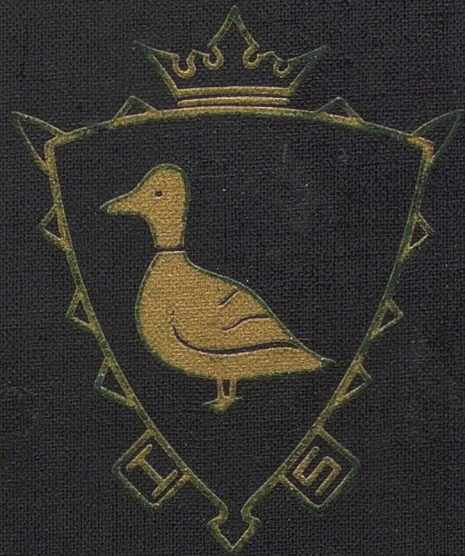

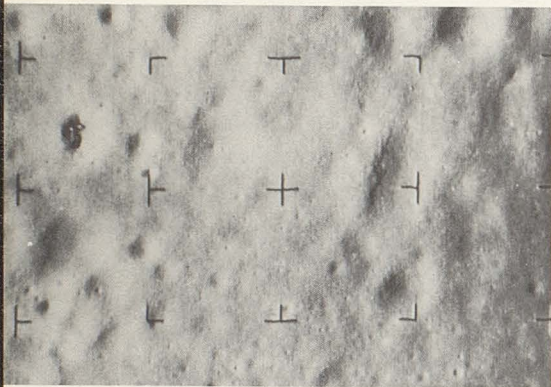

*Capital Appearance*—The Beatles performed for a youthful audience in Washington on the night of February 12.

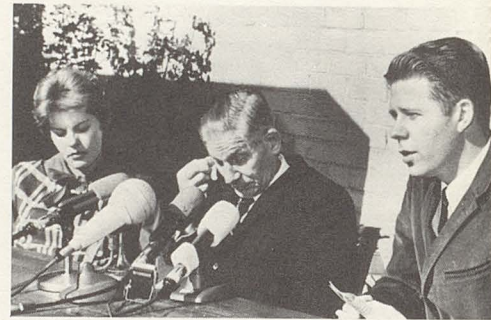

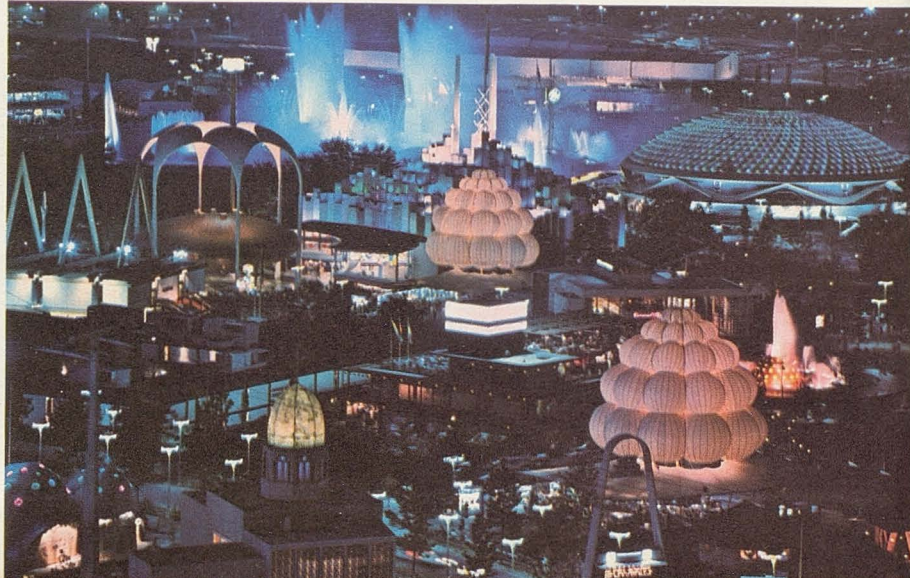

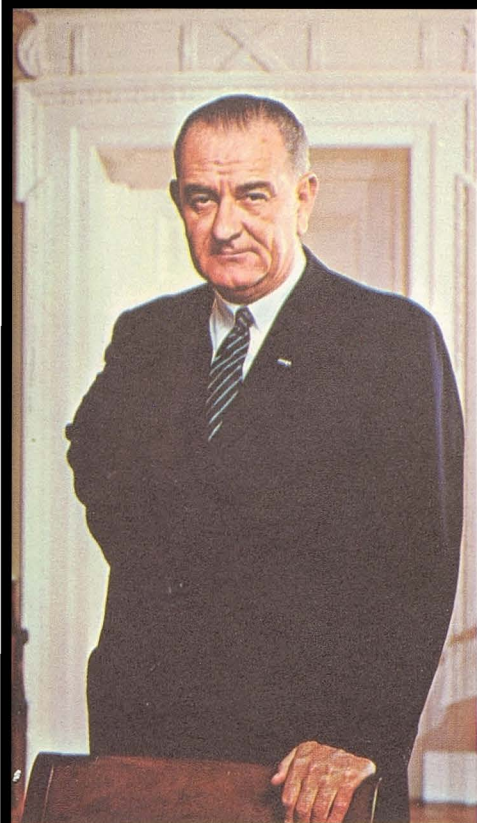

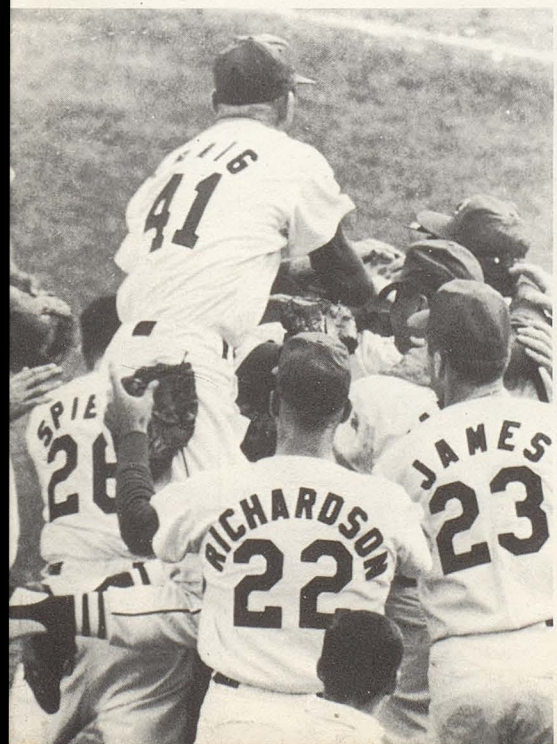

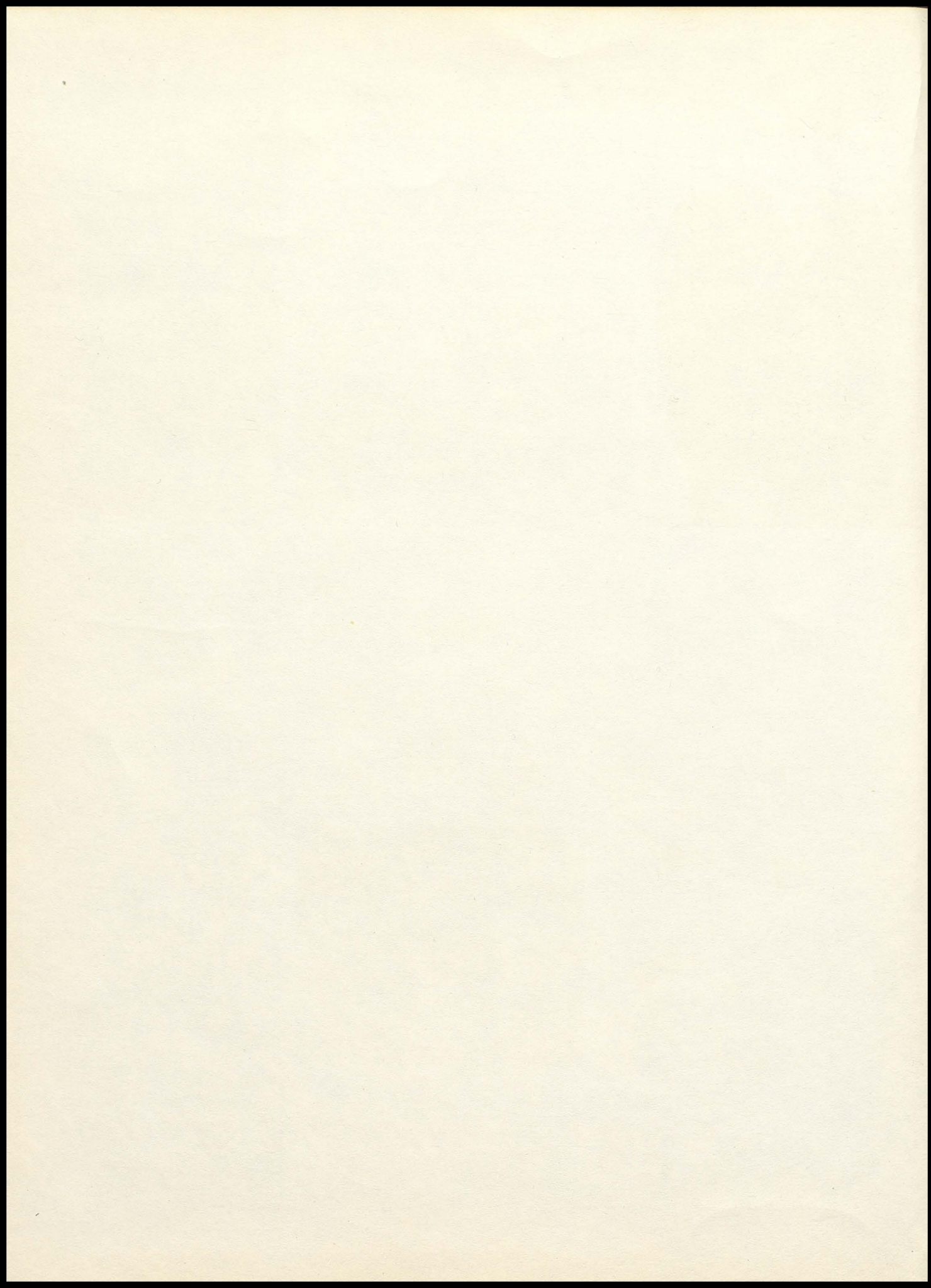

Mr. Lamppa, the father of six, enjoys photography, gardening, reading, and golf. During the summer, he is director of the Summer Recreation Program.



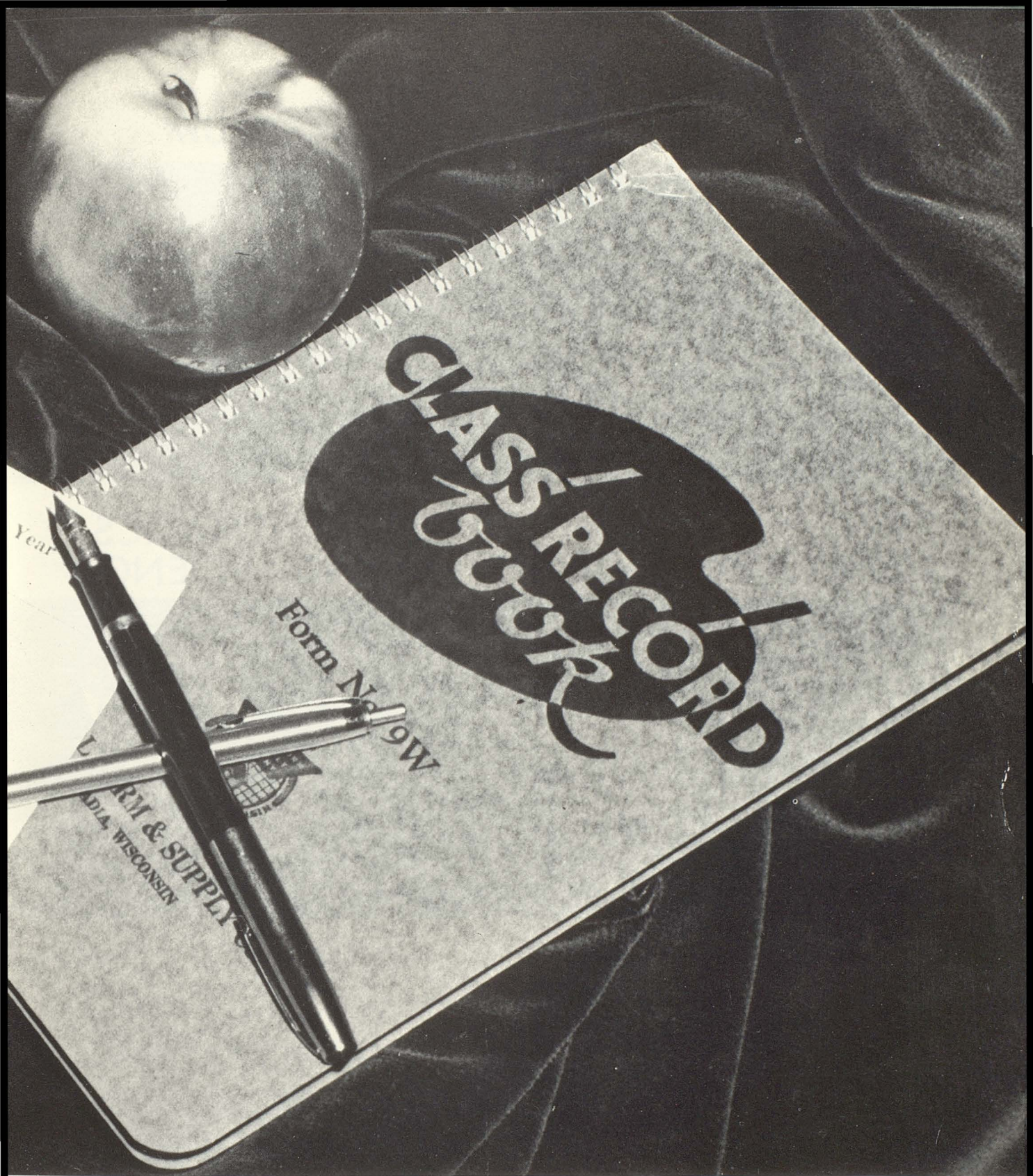

using a microscope. Examine the dishes daily for a week. Study the growth of the primary root and the formation of secondary roots and root hairs. Your observations might include measurements or drawings.

4. Cut a carrot lengthwise and crosswise and find the periderm, phloem, cambium, xylem, and secondary root. Record your observations in a diagram. Additional fleshy roots, such as a radish, parsnip, turnip, and rutabaga, might be used for comparison with the carrot. Notice especially the origin of the secondary roots. Pry the central cylinder of a carrot cut lengthwise and examine the secondary roots which grow through the phloem.

5. Cut several slices of cucumber. Put some in a dish of water. Put others in a dish containing salt water (10% solution). After five or ten minutes, examine the slices in both dishes. Explain your results.

6. Count out ten prunes. Select an average prune and measure its length.

9. Pick a plantain (plantain is good) with a foot long, the same kind rows, spaced with cloth.

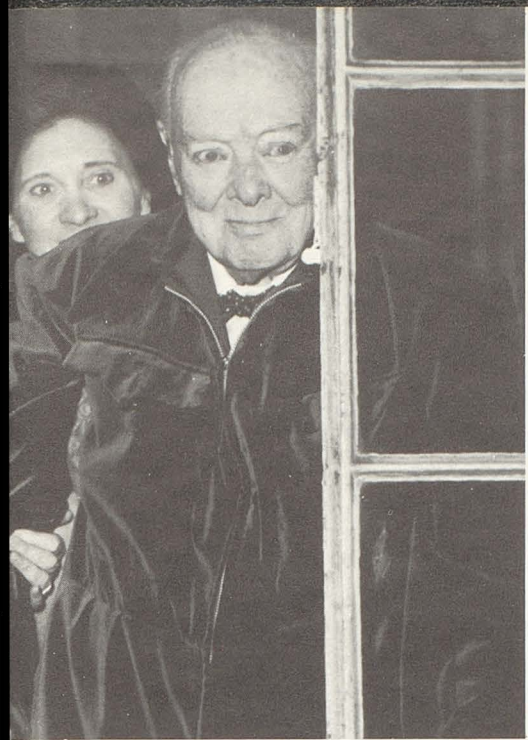

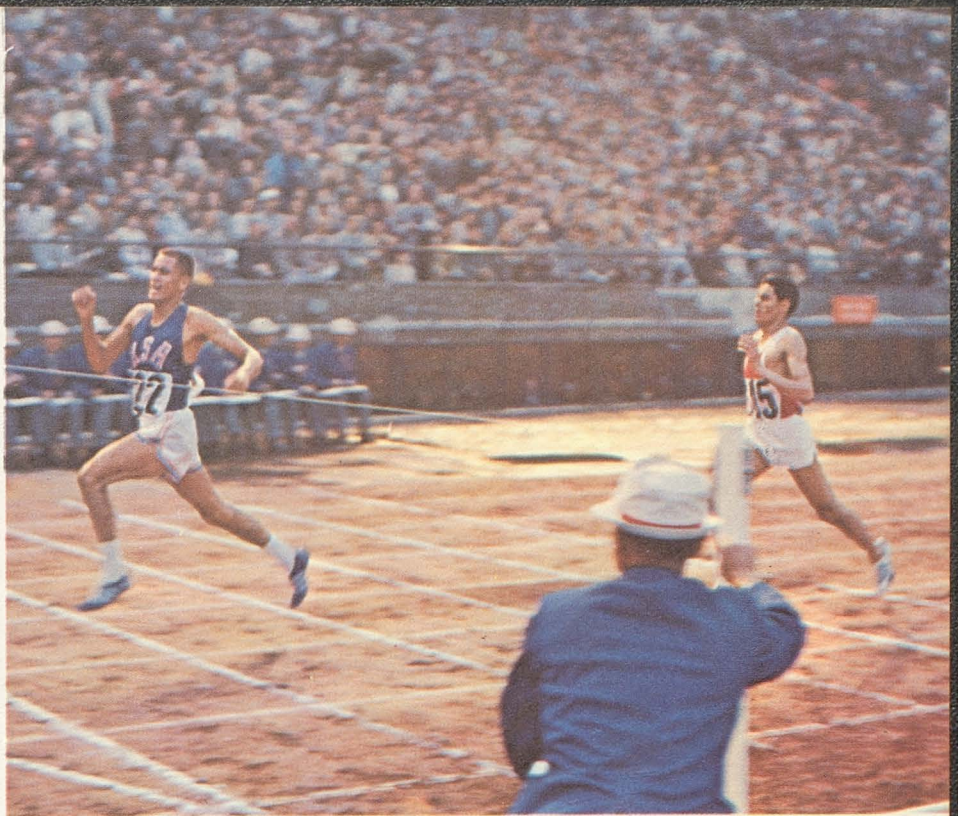
