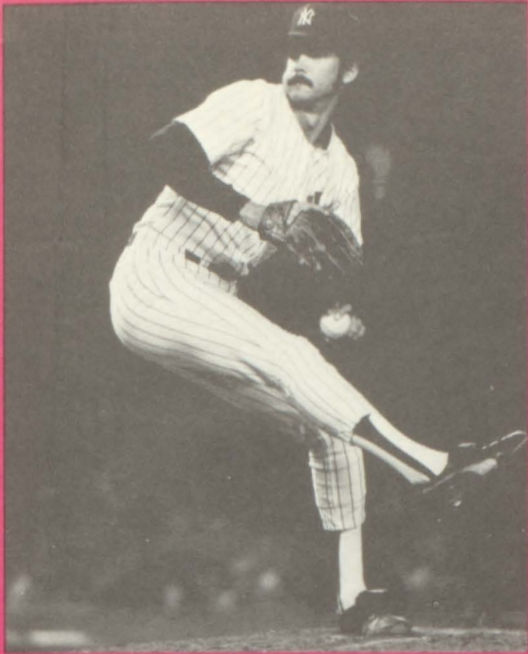
THREE IN A ROW AT WIMBLEDON

John Travolta ignites on the motion picture screen as an explosive disco kingpin at the peak of his popularity in the film "Saturday Night Fever."

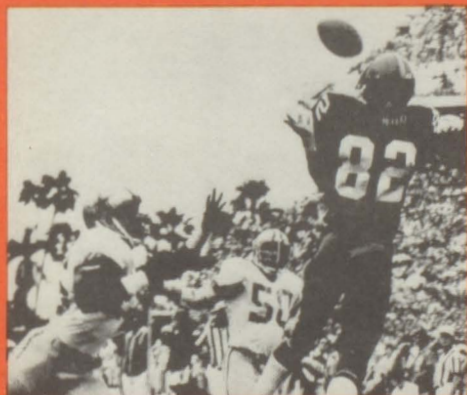
NORMAN ROCKWELL DIES

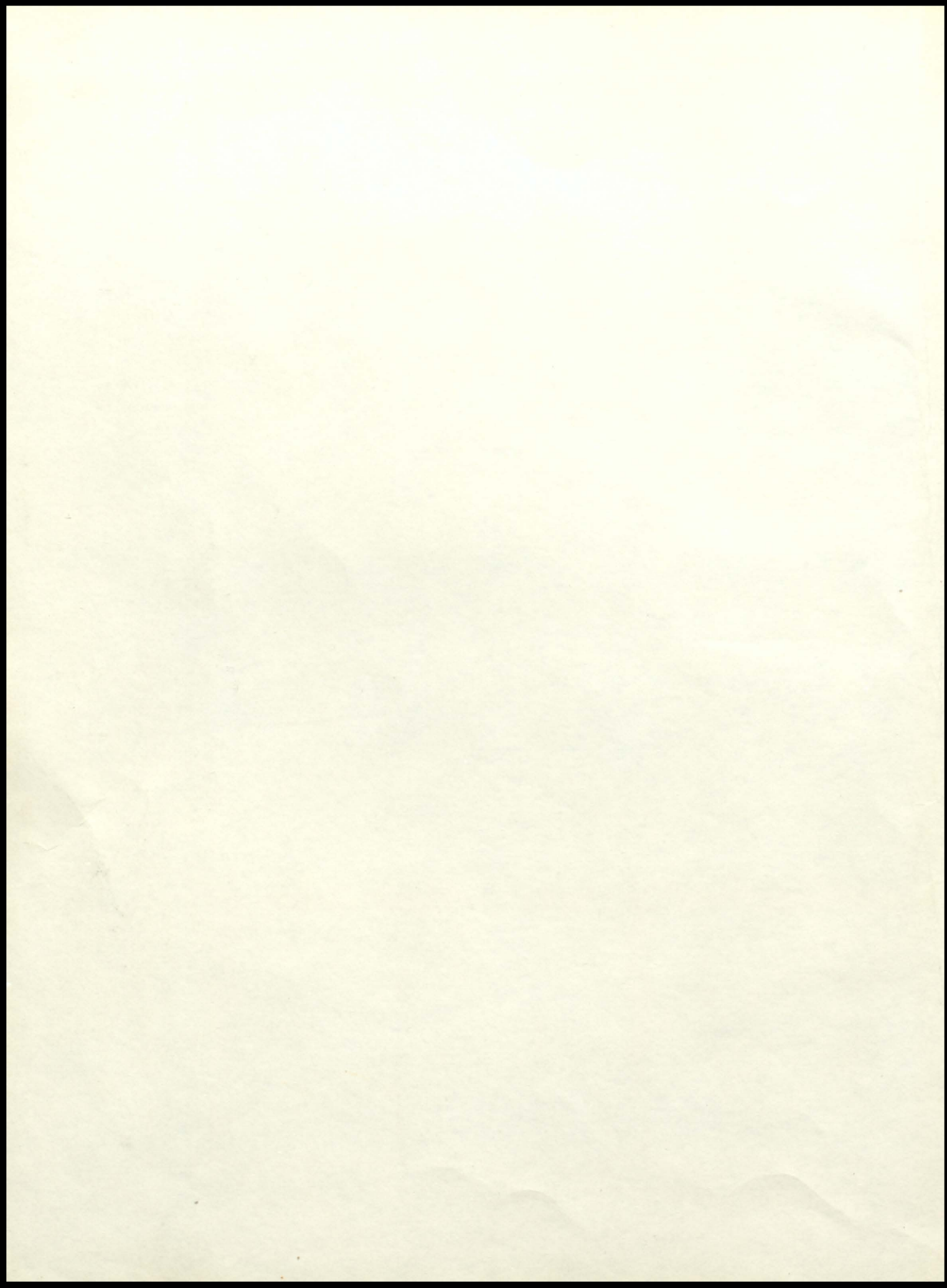
STEELERS REIGN SUPREME

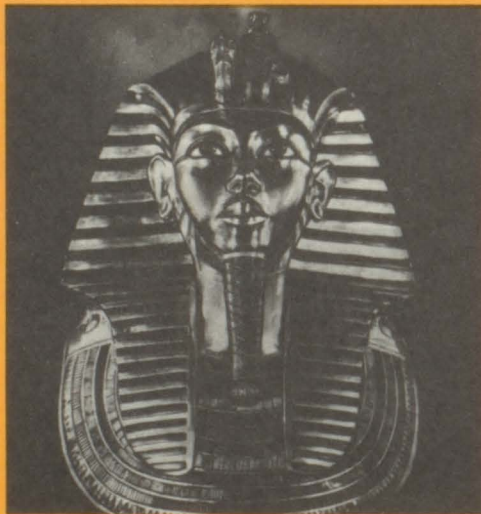

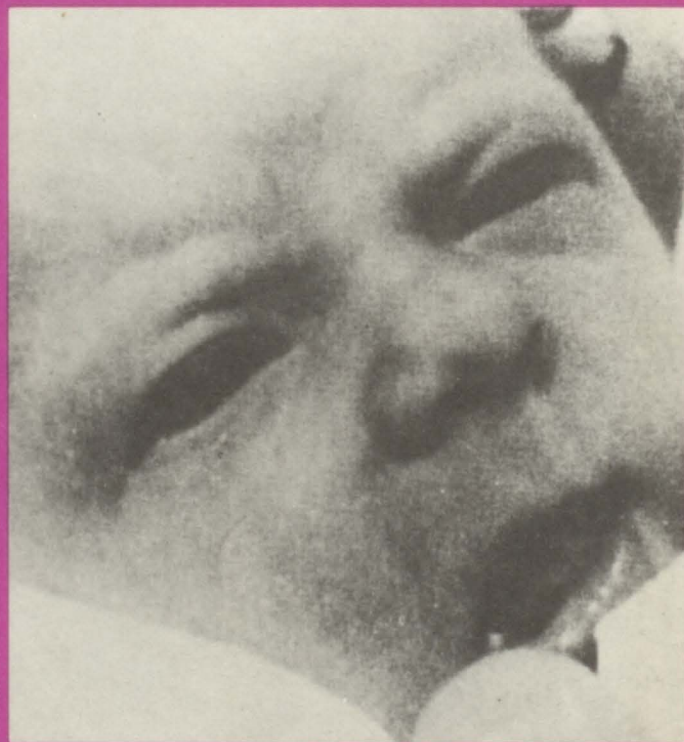
