They were things that the administration thought were unthinkable to have in a public school. Principal Glen Lakes said that some were negotiable but others were not. Prıncipal Lakes said he would like to see the students' energy directed toward more worthwhile things and used our food drive as an example. He said that he would have been more impressed if the protest had been for something more worthwhile, like for Nuclear Disarmament or the rights in South Africa.
